# The following rules are being proposed as amended rules:

## 4747-1-25: Safe Haven Program

This proposed new rule would administer a safe haven program through the Ohio Health Professionals Program for hearing aid dealers, hearing aid fitters, and trainee permit holders licensed under Ohio and Administrative Code Chapters 4747.

## 4753-1-13: Safe Haven Program

This proposed new rule would administer a safe haven program through the Ohio Health Professionals Program for audiologists, speech-language pathologists, conditional speech-language pathologists, and aides licensed under Ohio and Administrative Code Chapters 4753.

### 4747-1-23: Code of Ethics

This proposed amendment would make appropriate changes to the duty to report provisions under the code of ethics for hearing aid dealers, hearing aid fitters, and trainee permit holders in order to adequately administer the safe haven program through the Ohio Health Professionals Program.

#### 4753-9-01: Code of Ethics

This proposed amendment would make appropriate changes to the duty to report provisions under the code of ethics for audiologists, speech-language pathologists, conditional speech-language pathologists, and aides in order to adequately administer the safe haven program through the Ohio Health Professionals Program.
