New language added to the rule in paragraph (B) due to revisions on the JFS 01451 "Title IV-E Adoption Assistance Application" to align with the adoption form JFS 01667 "Adoption Information Disclosure." New language added to the rule

in paragraph (F)(2)(c) to include a copy of the JFS 01666 "Permanent Surrender of Child" being provided by the PCPA. Minor grammatical and spelling errors were corrected throughout the rule.
