NOTIFICATION OF PUBLIC HEARING Notice of hearing to amend Rules 4501:2-10-05 & 4501:2-10-09 of the Ohio Administrative Code in accordance with Chapter 119. of the Ohio Revised Code

Notice is hereby given that a hearing will be held by the Ohio Highway Patrol Division of the Ohio Department of Public Safety for the purpose of considering proposed amendment of the abovelisted administrative rules.

As authorized in Section 5503.10 of the Ohio Revised Code, the Ohio Highway Patrol Division of the Ohio Department of Public Safety proposes to amend Rules 4501:2-10-05 & 4501:2-10-09 of the Ohio Administrative Code regarding the Law Enforcement Automated Data System known as "LEADS."
